HOPEFitness – A Community-based Fitness Club run for Individuals with Special Needs

Several years ago, the DDPC recognized that delivery of health services to people with developmental disabilities was far more likely to react to illness than to promote wellness. There was little emphasis on what individuals could do to proactively prevent the need for medical intervention. The DDPC sponsored a series of grants to promote health and wellness in agencies as well as in communities. One of the results of these efforts was a greater need for community-based, inclusive fitness centers which are able to adapt to the varying abilities of their membership. Although the DDPC doesn't normally highlight fitness centers, we thought that the unique qualities of Hope Fitness in North Bellmore were worth noting in this publication.

HOPEFitness is a privately-owned, community-based gym which opened in 2006 that focuses on the specific-needs of individuals with disabilities. The facility and equipment are designed to allow for maximum participation while adjusting to the strengths and weaknesses of all individuals. The staff, whose composition includes athletic coaches and special education teachers, has a holistic approach to their program design. Therefore, individual participants are trained in the factors of health and wellness (i.e. diet and weight management) in addition to the proper use of equipment and techniques during classes or individual workouts.











The gym's operator, Harvey Greenberg, is a longtime Special Olympics coach and the parent of a young man with developmental disabilities. 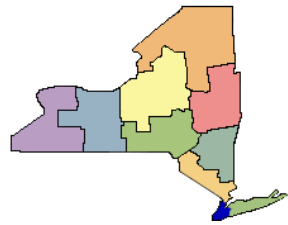
